FOOTBALL

HSU had a memorable 2006 season, recording a 9-1 record, the best mark since 1998. Senior DB Kyle Killingworth earned first team All-American honors while senior QB Blake Moorman became HSU's new career leader in passing yardage. Also, senior DL Todd Eagle was selected to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America first team.



SOFTBALL

Junior Lizzy Prescott and sophomore Marissa Slattery and Natalie Galletly were all named All-Americans as the squad compiled a 55-6 overall record and a 29-3 CCAA mark. The Lumberjacks claimed their eighth straight conference title and 17th all-time West Region appearance.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Jimmy Elam and Omar Lion finished 9th and 12th, respectively, at the CCAA Championships, helping the Jacks to a 5th place team finish. Humboldt State's team placed 11th overall in the men's division at the NCAA Division II West Region Championships. Limon earned the Jacks' top individual place, finishing 22nd.



WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

HSU's top five finished with an 18-second spread, leading to a fifth place team finish at the CCAA women's championships. Leading the Lumberjacks was freshman Megan Rolland, who placed 18th place in a time of 24:03 on the 6-kilometer course. HSU later finished 12th overall in the field of 18 at the DII West Region Championships.

MEN'S SOCCER

Continuing to make huge strides forward, the Lumberjacks turned in an 11-6-3 overall record and a 7-6-3 CCAA mark. The 2006 squad tied the program record for fewest goals allowed as well as recording the first winning season since 2000. In addition senior Keith Lambert and sophomore Geoff Houck earned all-West Region honors.



WOMEN'S SOCCER

HSU's eight seniors led the way in 2006, helping the Jacks to a school record-tying 12 victories and a berth in the CCAA Championship women's soccer tournament. Five Jacks were named to the all-CCAA squad while senior goalkeeper Staci Self was named to the all-West Region first team.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Humboldt State blasted its way to a school record 26-4 overall record, which included the CCAA championship and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA West Region Tournament. All-American Kevin Johnson led the Jacks to the championship game before they fell to No. 2 seeded Cal State San Bernardino.

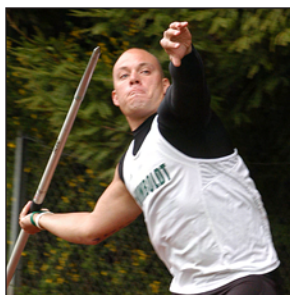


WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The Lumberjacks made a push for a second straight playoff berth, but fell just short, finishing the 2006-07 season with a 17-10 overall record and a 12-10 seventh place finish in the CCAA. Seniors Katie Wilder and Mia Spasowska earned all-West Region honors while Wilder was also named an honorable mention All-American.

MEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Nicholas Bawden earned All-American status after placing fifth in the men's javelin at the NCAA Division II National Championships. Jasper Peach had hoped to repeat his All-American status in the 3,000 meter steeplechase, but finished two spots shy of the top 12 in the preliminary, just missing the cut to move on to the finals.



WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD

Audrey Oswald earned her second straight All-American honor with a second-place finish in the women's hammer throw at the NCAA Division II National Championships. Another highlight came from freshman Megan Rolland who placed fourth in the 3000 meter steeplechase at the CCAA Championships in a school-record time of 11:26.57.

VOLLEYBALL

The Lumberjacks finished the 2006 season with a 9-15 overall record and a 6-14 mark in their first season competing in the California Collegiate Athletic Association. Senior libero Maya Domoto set a new HSU career record for digs, compiling 1,587 during her time as a Lumberjack.



WOMEN'S ROWING

Humboldt State's rowing squad won its own Blue Heron Redwood Sprints Regatta while varsity rower Melanie Rowsey was named Northwest Collegiate Rowing Conference Athlete of the Year. In addition, head coach Robin Meiggs was named NCRC co-coach of the year.

Dr. Rollin C. Richmond

University President

Rollin C. Richmond assumed the Humboldt State University presidency on July 1, 2002, becoming the sixth president in the history of the institution. He succeeded Alistair McCrone, who retired after serving as president since 1974.

Richmond most recently served as provost, the highest ranking academic officer, and professor of zoology at Iowa State University. Previously he served in a similar capacity at State University of New York at Stony Brook. He has also held positions of academic leadership and served on the biology faculty at the University of South Florida and Indiana University.

Richmond received a Ph.D in genetics from the Rockefeller University and a bachelor's degree in zoology from San Diego State University.

He has served on numerous national advisory committees, including a National Science Foundation panel on innovations in graduate education.

"I am honored by the opportunity to serve Humboldt State University as its sixth president. HSU faculty and staff are committed to providing students with a quality education that prepares them for fulfilling lives. I look forward to working with the university community and people of Humboldt County to strengthen the community and its university," Richmond said.

Richmond and his wife, Ann, have four adult children.



Dr. Steven Butler

Vice President of Student Affairs

Steven Butler, the recipient of two degrees and a teaching credential from Humboldt State in the 1970s, is currently serving as vice president of student affairs. Prior to this position he was vice president for student affairs and professor of education at Moorhead State University in Minnesota.

In 1973 Dr. Butler earned a bachelor of arts in political science from Humboldt and was awarded a secondary teaching credential in 1974. He earned a master of arts in social science from Humboldt in 1976 before earning a doctorate of education in counseling from the University of Southern California in 1987.

Dr. Butler has extensive experience in student relations, having served as vice president for students affairs at Peru State College in Nebraska, dean of student life at the University of Alaska at Anchorage, and director of housing, student and academic services also at the University of Alaska. He served in housing positions as director and assistant director at California State University, Bakersfield and was a senior residence hall coordinator at Humboldt.

Areas of expertise Dr. Butler brings to Humboldt State include student retention, student affairs' legal issues, and counseling.



Dan Collen Director of Athletics

Steady progress and across-the-board success have been the hallmarks of Humboldt State University Athletics since Dan Collen assumed the leadership of the program in December of 2001.

During Collen's tenure as Athletic Director, the Lumberjack scholarship fund has quadrupled, providing educational opportunities to a diverse population of student-athletes. Those same students have brought success to the court, fields and track, entertaining a supportive community that has generously contributed to fundraising efforts and corporate sponsorships.

Enhancement of facilities has also been a focus of Collen's leadership. Humboldt State's on-campus softball field and the recently completed Boating Instruction Safety Center are two prominent examples, and the Jacks will move into the new \$48 million PE and gymnasium complex during the 2007-08 academic year. A new soccer field is currently in the planning stages.

Collen's success is rooted in vast administrative experience that includes 21 years as director of Humboldt State's Center Activities. He has also served a variety of non-profit organizations, including the management of the Arcata Community Pool and as past president of the Arcata Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber honored Collen for his achievements, naming him Business Leader of the Year.

"I have a lot of loyalty to the department and the university, from my years as a student, a coach and an employee," Collen says. "There's a long tradition within the athletics program of providing students with a quality academic experience. I'm proud to be able to contribute to that tradition."

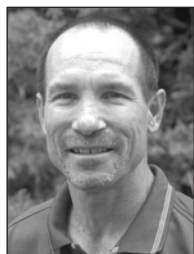
Collen's understanding of the coaching realm stems from his previous roles at the high school, college and United States Volleyball Association levels since 1977. He served as the Lumberjacks head volleyball coach for four seasons from 1989 to 1992 and compiled a career record of 83-44, including a 31-7 single season record in 1990.

He was an assistant coach for the HSU women's volleyball team and the head coach of the men's club team from 1977-79. Previously, Collen was the head coach of College of the Redwoods in 1981 and also coached high school and numerous nationally-ranked USVBA teams.

Collen, who was born in Corpus Christi, Texas, resides in Arcata with his wife, Sarah. Collen has three children, Arian, Corey and Marissa.

New-look Lumberjacks set sights on more success in 2007

ARCATA – Following up on a 9-1 season that goes down as the third best in 78 years of Humboldt State football history is the formidable challenge the 2007 Lumberjacks will be attempting this fall. Making that quest even more difficult is the loss of 23 seniors who played prominent roles in last year's success.

But overcoming a lack of experience within the Jacks' system is an ambition the HSU coaching staff retains heading into the fall campaign, which begins on Aug. 23 at the University of North Dakota. Head Coach Doug Adkins and his assistants will get a better notion of how high their hopes should be when they preview his year's Jacks on Thursday at the annual Green & Gold Scrimmage, scheduled for 6 p.m. in Redwood Bowl.

"We're a little behind where we'd like to be because it takes awhile for so many new players to learn the plays and the system," Adkins said. "But we're getting close to making a final evaluation."

Since the Lumberjacks first came to preseason camp on Aug. 1, they've been steadily increasing the intensity of workouts. A rash of minor injuries, however, has somewhat hindered progress, Adkins said.

"Many of the new players didn't come prepared for this level of football, conditioning-wise, so we've seen quite a few injuries of that nature," Adkins said. "The influx of players has also made for some inconsistency. One day we look like the best team in the nation, and the next we look like the worst."

Following is an assessment of the Lumberjacks' personnel heading into this week's scrimmage.

Offense Quarterback

The graduation of Blake Moorman, who passed for 2,388 yards in 2006, leaves a significant vacancy to fill. But with Moorman watching from the sidelines as an assistant coach this fall, several talented players will try to earn the right to be his successor.

As the lone Jack with game experience, junior J.D. Hellinger has an advantage of

familiarity with the offense. But Adkins expects transfers Garrett Hubrich and Brian Hildebrand to join Hellinger in a tight battle for starting honors.

"We were very uncertain about quarterback before the fall, but then Brian received a health clearance and Garrett came in looking good," Adkins said. "J.D. is also healthy. With all of them battling, we're not prepared to make a decision on our No. 1 at this point."

Hubrich has looked solid in his bid for a starting assignment after passing for 1,731 yards and 15 touchdowns at Shasta JC in 2006. Hildebrand, who last took the field in 2005 for Mt. SAC JC, has impressive credentials that led him to being the expected starter at powerhouse Nebraska last year before health concerns kept him off the field.

Running Backs

Both Marcus Cox and Joevany Cueva return for HSU after stellar contributions in 2006. Cox added eight touchdowns and an average 5.2 yards per carry in only seven games, while Cueva averaged 34.0 yards per game with seven touchdowns in nine games.

Neither Cox nor Cueva are guaranteed the bulk of the carries this fall, however, as an influx of highly-regarded newcomers has in the very least increased the depth in this area. Corey Stollmeyer, out of Allan Hancock JC, and Cornell Candidate, a transfer from Arizona State, are the most prominent newcomers.

Stollmeyer averaged 7.9 yards per carry, totaling 542 yards in only eight games at Allan Hancock in 2006. Candidate's bright career at ASU and in the Pac-10 began with a sensational freshman season, but he has battled health issues that have kept him off the field the past two seasons.

Receivers

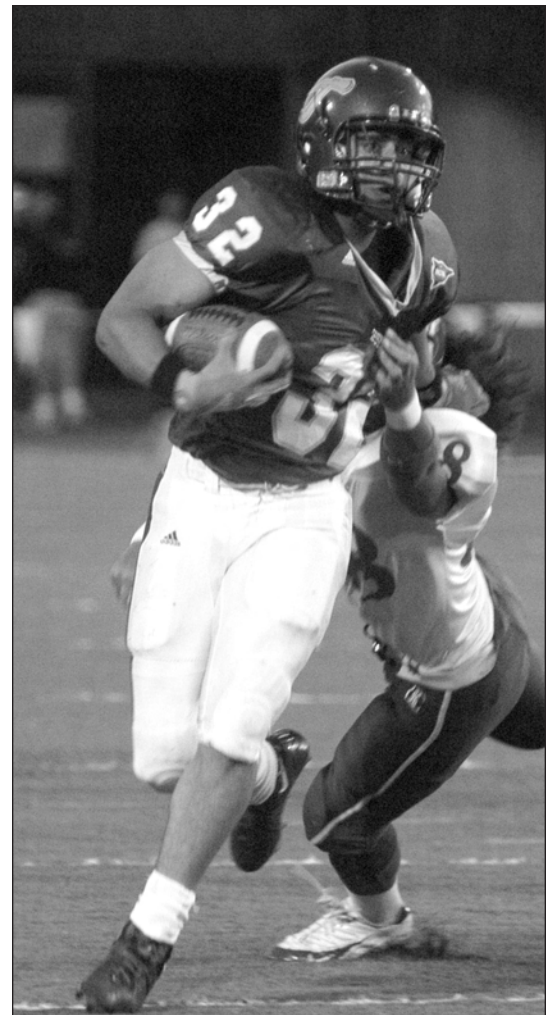
Edwin Henry, who averaged

21.1 yards per catch last year, will be filling the slot left by last year's top receiver, Joey Stein, as will returner Richard Perkins. In 2006 Perkins averaged 14.4 yards per catch while scoring four touchdowns.

A wild card in the Jacks' mix is returner Darren Ross, who has seen action in only three games in two seasons at HSU because of injuries. Ross had 11 catches in his Jacks' debut performance in 2005, but missed the rest of the year with a hand injury. In 2006 he lasted two games, catching six passes for 62 yards before another injury knocked him out of action.

New to the mix are Anthony Fletcher, a junior transfer from Sacramento City College, and Corey Anderson, who previously played for UNLV. Both had success at their previous schools, and have also looked good in early practices.

At tight end, Matt Devlin, who redshirted





last season, is a potential impact player. He joins returners Travis Gibb and Matt Rose, both of whom saw time in the Jacks' lineup last year.

Offensive Line

Veteran leadership provided by four returning starters makes the offensive interior one of HSU's strengths this season. Seniors Adam Maser and Richard Torrence, and juniors Bryant Kendall and Adam Maser all were consistent starters for the Lumberjacks in 2006. Another player who saw significant time was senior Avery Bustamante, who moves over into the center position this season.

"They're a little bigger, a little faster, and a little stronger, so there are plenty of reasons to believe our offensive line will be a strength of this team," Adkins said.

Defense

Defensive Line

In an area particularly lean on returning players, Lucius Mills at end and Jacob Accetta at tackle lead the way on the defensive line. Mills had 10 tackles and four sacks in 2006, while Accetta only played in two games before an injury ended his season. Also at the defensive end spot will be Johnny Terrell, who previously was a standout linebacker for HSU in 2005.

Newcomers Aaron Hernandez, out of Ventura College, Brad Hunkins, from

American River JC, and Mitch Solano, out of Feather River JC, should contain on the outside of the line. On the interior, tackles Lorenzo Arenas, from College of the Siskiyous, and Shadedee Hasan, from Contra Costa CC, are expected to contribute, as is Desmond Maxwell, a former Lumberjack who returns to the fold after a stint at Alcorn State.

Linebackers

One of the team's strengths is expected to be this position, solidified by the return of Allen Brunner, who sat out last year and is back for his senior season. Also returning is Brian Iriye, who played for the Jacks in 2005 and ranked third on the team in tackles with 81. Also back is another experienced Lumberjack, David DeMarco, who was out with an injury last year, and Michael Moore, who saw limited time last season.

Transfers further strengthen this area. Among them are Justin Calcote, who led the West Los Angeles JC team with 54 tackles despite playing only seven games in 2006, and Eric Peevey, who was the No. 2 tackler at Santa Ana JC last year with 59. Troubled with injuries during preseason is another contender, Calvin Robinson, who joins the Jacks as a sophomore after one season at Sacramento State.

Secondary

With a couple of key players to replace - most notably All-American Kyle Killingsworth - the Lumberjacks will turn to solid returners Nate Turner and Derrick Andrews, along with a group of impressive newcomers. Turner saw the field in a backup role at free safety last fall, and Andrews worked into a starter's role at cornerback.

Instant effectiveness for the Jacks' backfield will come from two Division I transfers, Mombroso Washington and Elijah Bonner. Washington was with the University of Utah in 2006 after starring for two years

at San Bernardino Valley JC, and Bonner comes to HSU after redshirting one year and playing another at Utah State.

Also seeking playing time are Adam Diaz, who earned Scholar-Athlete and all-conference honors at College of the Siskiyous, and Barry Davis, a junior from Los Angeles Southwest JC. Caleb Flores, from Citrus College, Martin Henderson, from Miramar JC, and Justin Price, out of College of the Canyons are all talented players that should see the field.

Kicking Game

Battling to be the Jacks' primary place-kicker is returner Nicholas Nelson, and transfers Enrique Leyva and Kyle Schierholt. Nelson was primarily used for kick-offs last year, but will also contend for field goal and extra point duty this fall.

Leyva, a junior, comes to the Jacks from the University of Utah, where he sat out last season. He previously attended Palomar JC, where he was a perfect 20-of-20 in extra points and 9-of-16 in field goals in 2004.

Schierholt is a sophomore who transferred to Humboldt State from Northern State, where he was the primary kicker last year for the Aberdeen, S.D. school. He'll also try to assume the Jacks' punting chores, where he'll contend along with Leyva and returning sophomore Shea Lemos.

Doug Adkins Head Coach

Doug Adkins, Humboldt State's 14th head football coach, has completed seven seasons at the helm of the Lumberjacks program, with his best season thus far coming in 2006.

Last fall, Humboldt State stormed its way to a 9-1 record, which included eight straight victories.

In 2004, Adkins led the Lumberjacks to a 5-5 overall finish, the first non-losing season since 1997. In his second season Adkins guided the Jacks to a 4-7 overall finish and a 1-2 finish in the conference which put HSU in a tie for second place. In 2000, HSU finished 4-7 overall in the very competitive Columbia Football Association.

Prior to becoming HSU's head



coach, Adkins was a defensive line coach at NCAA Division IA Nevada-Reno. Adkins returned to the Lumberjacks' program he helped build into a nationally respected defensive unit in the early 90s. From 1990 to 1994 Adkins' "Green Chain" defense led

the Northern California Athletic Conference in every category, contributing to Humboldt's first NCAC title in 1994.

Before coming to Humboldt for his initial stint, Adkins was the defensive coordinator at Oregon Institute of Technology from 1989-1990 and served in the same role at Central Washington University from 1984-1989. He was offensive line coach at Wenatchee Valley College from 1972 to 1974 and at Central Washington from 1971 to 1973.

After leaving Humboldt in 1994, Adkins helped guide Nevada-Reno to consecutive appearances in the Las Vegas Bowl. During his 26-year coaching career, Adkins has been associated with 14 league championship teams, four unbeaten teams and five that have advanced to their respective na-

After completing his B.A. in physical education at HSU in 1994, White earned his teaching credential from the university the following year. He completed his M.S. at HSU in 1998.

At College of the Redwoods White's responsibilities included planning and implementing all offensive phases of the game, along with directing the strength and conditioning program. He also taught health education and activity classes at CR.

During the 2003 season, Boise State led the NCAA Division I in team scoring at 43.0 points per game and was third in team passing efficiency with a 159.76 rating.

Prior to Harris' arrival at Boise State he served as running back coach at Portland State University for five years. Harris played his collegiate football at Portland State where he was a wide receiver from 1994-1998, catching 78 career passes.

"Brian brings a new look to our offense," Adkins said. "His scheme will allow us more opportunity to establish the running game." Harris graduated from Portland State in 2000 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Liberal Studies.

Co-Defensive Coordinator

Shay McClure begins his second year as the Lumberjacks' co-defensive coordinator.

Prior to directing the Southern Oregon Raiders as the interim head coach in 2005, McClure served four years as SOU's defensive coordinator, with the

additional duties of recruiting coordinator, fitness center manager and strength and conditioning coach.

During his undergraduate playing career, McClure starred at defensive back for SOU from 1992-94 and coached the Raider defensive backs in 1995 and 1996.

Included in his previous experience is a two-year role as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator at NCAA Div. IAA University of San Diego. McClure also helped guide NCAA Div. III Occidental to an 8-1 record and the 2001 Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship.

"Shay's expertise will help us in several areas, and not just with defense," Adkins said. "He has a reputation as an outstanding recruiter, particularly in Southern California."

Bowl gets new turf

In May of 2001, the university completed an \$875,000 project that replaced the natural grass in Redwood Bowl with a turf system that will allow the field to be used much more for physical education classes and recreation programs. The synthetic surface and advanced drainage system can withstand severe wet weather without compromising traction.

Under the carpet of nylon-based grass is an “E-layer” (for “elastic”), and among the blades is a fill of rubber granules — together representing more than 30,000 recycled tires. The surface, similar to those used at the University of Washington and the University of Nebraska, has been proven to reduce the incidence of injuries.

The birth of the Bowl

When newly appointed Director of Athletics and Head Football Coach Joseph Forbes arrived in Arcata during the summer of 1946, he found a partially-completed football field. “Correspondence assured me that Redwood Bowl would be ready for the football season and this was my introduction to state policy in construction, as the field was not even planted until June,” Forbes said in his “Athletic History of Humboldt State College.”

In September, the bleachers were constructed by students under the direction of the local carpenter’s union and redwood bark was placed over the rocks on the track to prevent injury to football players. The first time the field was lined with marking, it was found to be too narrow, but for years was utilized at a width

of 150 feet instead of the regulation 160. “No wonder it looked so long between goalposts,” Forbes said.

The first game in Redwood Bowl was played on Sunday, Oct. 8, 1946, with the Stanford University JV defeating Humboldt State, 20-0. Two weeks later, when Stanford’s varsity played its first game of the season against UCLA, eight of the “JV” starters against the Lumberjacks were varsity starters. Stanford had been secured for the dedication game in Redwood Bowl to ensure a large crowd. No attendance figures are available, however.

Complaints from merchants whose Saturday afternoon trade was being drawn away by football games

encouraged administrators to begin a campaign geared toward funding lights for Redwood Bowl. In the spring of 1947, lights were purchased from a firm in Iowa for \$2,000, with another \$1,000 for switches and wiring. Alumnus Bunny Hadley of Flash Electric donated the labor to wire the field, and poles were donated by a lumber operator. Payment for the remainder of the work, including leasing a crane and operator, was through a \$4,000 loan secured through Bank of America and paid off out of student fees over the next several years.

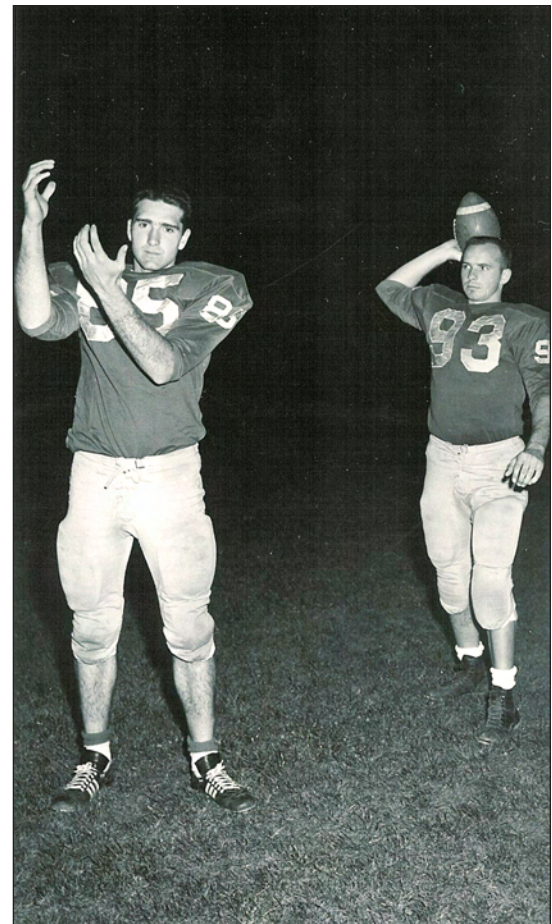

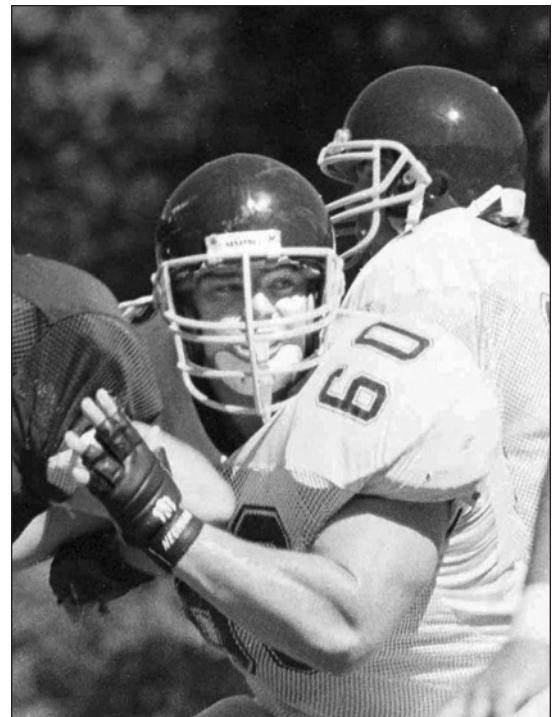

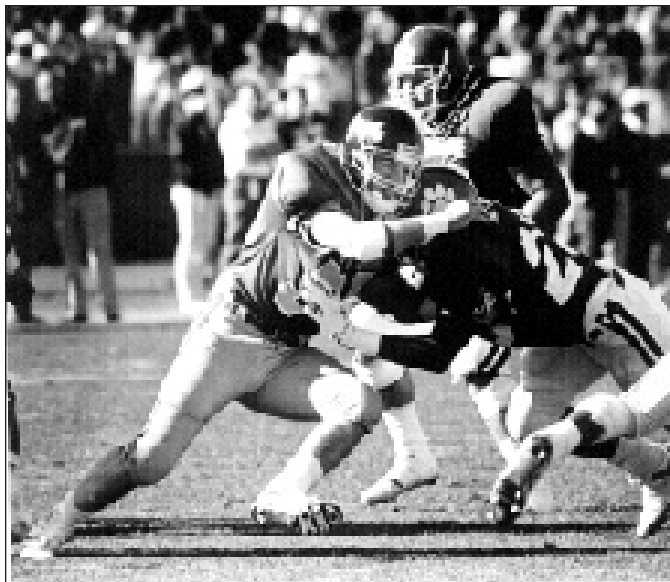

Former Humboldt State linebacker David Harper, pictured above, was inducted into the Humboldt State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998 following a career in the CFL and NFL. Other HSU players once active in the professional ranks include wide receiver Freeman Baysinger, who returned kicks and was a receiver in the CFL, Chris Butterfield, Mike Mari Jr., Omar Daniel and Brian Lytle, all with careers in the Arena Football League, Scotty Reagan, who was drafted into the NFL and played Arena ball, and Richard Ashe, who has played in the NFL and Arena leagues.

Lumberjacks in the Pros

Steve Cheek, who was a punter for HSU from 1997-99, led NFL Europe in punting for two years, and has played in the NFL for the Glants, Eagles, Texans and Cheifs.

Chris Butterfield, who played at HSU from 1993-96, played for the L.A. Avengers, the Portland Forest Dragons and the Oklahoma Wranglers, all of the Arena Football League, from 1996-2005.

Brian Lytle, signed as a free agent by the St. Louis Rams in 1999, then went to NFL Europe in 2000.. He was a member of the San Jose Sabercats from 2000-04. He played for HSU in 1998.

Mike Mari, Jr., who played at HSU from 1995-98, was a linemen for the Oklahoma Wranglers and San Jose Sabercats of the Arena Football League until from 1999-2002.

Omar Daniel, a Lumberjack from 1995-98, played for the Billings Thunderboldt (2000) and the Southern Oregon Heat (2001), both of the Arena Football League.

Rodney Dickerson, a Lumberjack from 1991-92, played in the CFL for Sacramento and Birmingham, before finishing his career in the Arena Football League playing for the San Jose Sabercats from 1996-98.

Freeman Baysinger, drafted by New England Patriots in 1991, played in the CFL for Calgary and Sacramento. He was a member of the Lumberjack squad from 1988-1991.

Scotty Reagan, who was drafted in the seventh round by the Minnesota Vikings also played for the Falcons and Raiders. He then played Arena ball in Orlando and Tampa Bay. Reagan played HSU football from 1987-1990.

David Harper, a linebacker, played for the Dallas Cowboys in the NFL and in the CFL. After his stint with the Cowboys Harper played in the Canadian Football League, where he shined for Sacramento, San Antonio and Ottawa. Harper was San Antonio's leading tackler in 1995 and was chosen to the All-Southern Division team. He played for HSU in the 1988-89 seasons.

Richard Ashe, who has played in the NFL for the L.A. Rams and N.Y. Giants and in the Arena League for the Arizona Rattlers, was a Lumberjack from 1985-88.

Corney Ross, who played for HSU from 1986-87, played in the CLF and Arena League for four years.

Eddie Pate, a wide receiver for HSU from 1981-83 and 1985, signed with the San Diego Chargers and played one season before injury ended his career.

Kurt Garl played for HSU from 1980-81, signed with the 49ers, then played two seasons in the CFL.

R.W. Hicks was a center for the HSU team from 1971-73. He played for several NFL teams before finishing out his career with the Detroit Lions in 1975.

Mike Bettiga, an HSU Hall of Famer, was a second team all-conference wide receiver at HSU from 1972-73. He went on to play for the 49ers.

Len Gotshalk, a Lumberjack from 1969-70, played six seasons for the Atlanta Falcons.

Wendell Hayes, a Lumberjack in 1962, was drafted as a running back by the Kansas City Cheifs and played in Superbowl IV.

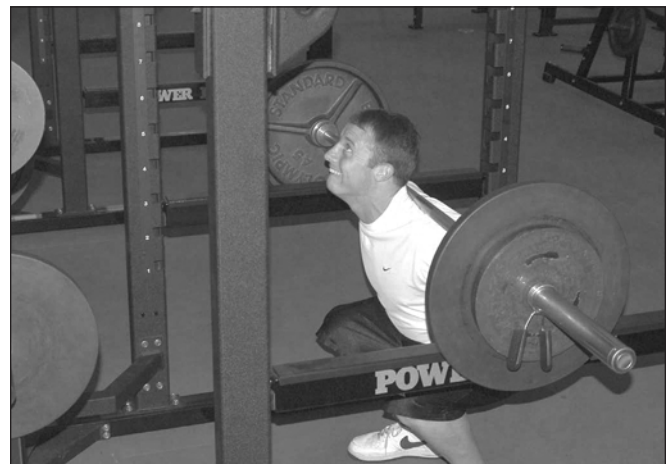
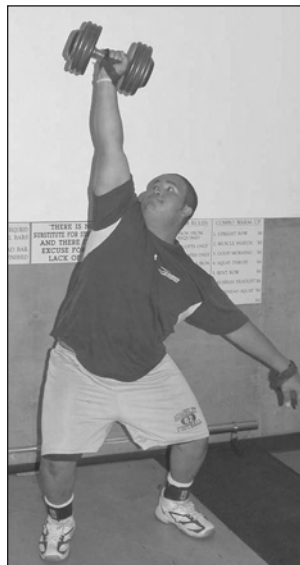
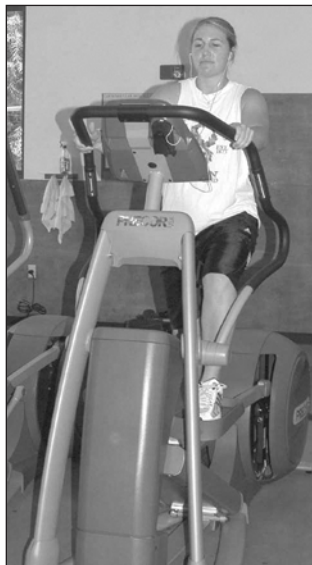

Humboldt State University's Athletic Training Program's primary goal is to prepare students for Certification by the National Athletic Trainers' Association while simultaneously improving their opportunities for admission into health science graduate programs that could enhance and compliment entrance into a Sports Medicine profession. The program provides a diverse curriculum that includes both didactic and varied clinical experiences.

Our educational philosophy revolves around student participation in all aspects of the athletic program. We are firm believers that students learn best through active participation in the care and prevention of injuries as they occur in the sport setting. To accomplish these goals students participate in athletic event coverage for our intercollegiate sports, intramural activities, club sports and local high school interscholastic sports.

Humboldt State University is working toward accreditation of its program by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). Our current program is directed toward assisting our students in meeting the requirements for the internship route for Athletic Trainer Certification.

Fundraising efforts for 2006-07 were once again anchored by the success of the annual Sports Auction and the ever-growing corporate partner program – which combined to raise almost three-quarters of a million dollars.

Sports Auction

Student-athlete success was again supported by the community, which contributed more than \$244,000 to HSU Athletics during the 22nd Annual Celebrity Dinner and Sports Auction - the most in event history. More than \$74,000 was donated directly to scholarships during the event, with the difference comprised of auction items and ticket sales revenue. NFL Hall of Famer Paul Hornung was the guest speaker.

Corporate Partners

Local businesses contributed almost half a million dollars to athletics in 2006-07. The Corporate Partner program generated 21 cash partners who combined to contribute more than \$80,000 and 30 in-kind partners who contributed almost \$200,000 in goods and services. In addition, one local business pledged \$200,000 to complete the bleacher project in the new gymnasium – scheduled to open in early 2008. The in-kind trades included ADA walkways and safety fencing around the bleachers at the soft-ball field.

Other Fundraisers

A ticket strategy to enhance scholarships was developed during 2006-07, effective for the 2007-08 basketball season. In addition to paying for the tickets, season ticket holders will be asked to purchase a Season Ticket Scholarship Donation (STSD). The additional donation goes 100% toward scholarships, and the ticket buyer receives the opportunity to select the best available seat and retain that seat for five years. The STSD is an option that ensures the buyer a particular seat location. Season tickets can be purchased without the STSD – but those purchasers will get their seats after others have selected theirs.

The football program teamed with the University Advancement Office for its 2nd Annual Phonathon. The expertise of the Advancement Office paid immediate dividends as the fundraiser doubled its totals from 2006.

The 17th Annual Women's Walk and the 3rd Annual Liftathon kicked off the fundraising year in the fall. Women's Walk was held on Saturday, Sept. 23, 2006, and raised more than \$40,000. All of the money raised supports the HSU women's athletic teams. The Liftathon was a football fundraiser, and it raised more than \$11,000.

2006-07 Community Service Activities

- The department shared in its success with the community, attracting nearly 45,000 fans to campus to view athletics.

- Humboldt State student-athletes expanded their community outreach through the efforts of the Student Athlete Advisory Committee. Projects during the 2006-07 year included a food drive for Arcata Endeavor; the Giving Tree charitable drive collecting clothing, toys, and canned goods for local distribution to underprivileged families; a dodgeball tournament with all proceeds going to Food for People; and Read Across American, which promotes literacy among school children.

- The cooperative effort involving Athletics and the Health Center for a three-year \$30,000 NCAA grant geared at studying alcohol abuse on campus continued in 2006-07. This CHOICES & Changes program will further utilize athletics and student-athletes as a conduit to promote alcohol awareness and support prevention and intervention services on campus.

Youth Sports Camps/Clinics

- Humboldt State's women's basketball team runs an annual Little Lady Jacks Club. Girls in first through seventh grades can participate in two clinics per year as well as exhibition games during halftime of the Jacks home games.

- HSU's women's soccer team began a club of their own in 2002, the Junior Jacks Club. Girls in grades first through eighth participate in two individual and two group training sessions, along with other club amenities. In 2004, the Junior Jacks Club was increased to include young boys as well as head men's and women's soccer coach Andy Cumbo implemented the club in both of his programs.

- In the summer of 2007 Humboldt State's athletic teams put on numerous sports camps (men's basketball, women's basketball, men's soccer, women's soccer, football and volleyball) geared towards the community's youth. From second graders to high schoolers, more than 500 youth participated in Lumberjack sports camps in the summer of 2007.

Located Among Natural Wonders

At Humboldt, we believe our top priority is to provide a high-quality education. It just so happens that a first-class educational experience can be obtained in one of the most beautiful natural areas in the country. Humboldt State's campus is set between the blue-green waters of the Pacific Ocean and towering redwood groves throughout our mountains.

For those who are energized by challenging academic and recreational experiences, attending Humboldt State is an opportunity hard to resist. Many students, faculty and staff take advantage of our region's six rivers, numerous forests and mountain ranges, accessible wilderness, and many beaches.

There is an abundance of recreational opportunities to walk, hike, bike, fish, raft, kayak, surf (in a wet suit), explore nature, or simply relax.

Humboldt State University is the California State University's (CSU's) northernmost and western most campus, located in Arcata, just a few miles north of Eureka, the county seat. The campus is 270 miles north of San Francisco and about 100 miles south of the Oregon border. The area is served by two airlines.

Humboldt Students

It is not easy to define a "typical" Humboldt student, but we have come up with some generalities. Since most of our students travel at least 300 miles to attend Humboldt, they tend to be more independent and adventuresome; they aren't going to the university that their parents or their sister or perhaps anyone in their high school went to—they have made their own choices. Our students also exhibit a strong sense of social commitment. These two factors may explain Humboldt's historically high proportion of graduates who enter the Peace Corps.



It has been shown that students who leave home to attend college are better prepared. This holds up for Humboldt students: the average SAT score of our incoming freshmen is 1054, with an average high school grade point average of 3.16. Even our older students who may be reentering the University after a break in their educations are different. They don't come only from the immediate area, they pack up and move here just like our first-time freshmen.

Humboldt's 7,500 student body is divided fairly evenly by sex, about 50/50, with just a few more women than men. Approximately 96% of our students come from California, but our nonresident students come from 44 states and 19 foreign countries.

How do our students feel about Humboldt? According to a recent Student Needs and Priorities Survey (SNAPS), Humboldt State University students are more satisfied with their university than their counterparts at any other California State University campus. Humboldt students rated the university "considerably higher" for instructional quality, accessibility of faculty, and course content.

Many reside on campus for their first and second years. Additionally, approximately 75% of our 7,500 students live on campus, or very nearby.

Our goal is to provide you with comfortable and safe housing, as well as good dining services, in a convenient location. Additionally, we hope to support you in your academic pursuits by emphasizing a community atmosphere conducive to study, and

assist you in your personal development by offering a multitude of activities that focus on social interaction, education growth, social justice, and many other areas.



Student leadership in the residence halls plays a major role in the determination of community living standards. As a resident, you share in the responsibility of positively influencing your residence hall environment. An understanding of and respect for the rights of self and others is of utmost importance in making these experiences meaningful.

Life on campus is much more than eating, studying and sleeping. The residence halls offer students a place to live and learn, make lifelong friendships, and experience community living. There are opportunities for students to become involved in numerous social and educational programs, serve in leadership positions with the residence hall student government and participate in special living environments.

The benefits of living on campus are numerous. Studies have shown that students who live in residence halls get better grades, are more active in academic activities and have a lower drop out rate than the general University population. Another benefit is convenience. You don't have to spend time preparing meals or commuting to school and you are



close to campus resources such as the HSU library, recreational facilities and classrooms. Living on campus is a great way to begin your career at HSU.

Quality Higher Education

U.S. News and World Report has consistently ranked Humboldt in the top 10% of universities nationally for many years, and currently ranks Humboldt in a three-way tie for the No. 3 top regional public university in the west.

Humboldt enrolls about 7,500 students in more than 100 degree and certificate programs. Founded as a school to train teachers in 1913, it was one of the first campuses of what would become the 23-campus California State University (CSU). Humboldt has become a vital, vibrant institution that fosters academic excellence and rich educational opportunities, innovative research, solutions to critical social problems, and a sense of community service among its students.

Academic Distinction

Humboldt has long been a leading launchpad for students who go on to earn doctorates in science, particularly biology, according to National Science Foundation surveys. In its most recent report on such "undergraduate origins," in sheer numbers, Humboldt ranked 11th among 529 campuses classified as "master's colleges and universities." However, when the top 25 are adjusted for enrollment size, Humboldt's production of future Ph.D.s is the highest of any similarly classified public institution in the country and more than twice that of any other CSU campus.

In 2000-2001, the mean score of Humboldt State's business students placed Humboldt above the 96th percentile of the nearly 400 institutions that participated in the Major Field Test in Business, including 97th percentile in quantitative business analysis, 98th percentile in international issues and the 99th percentile in marketing.

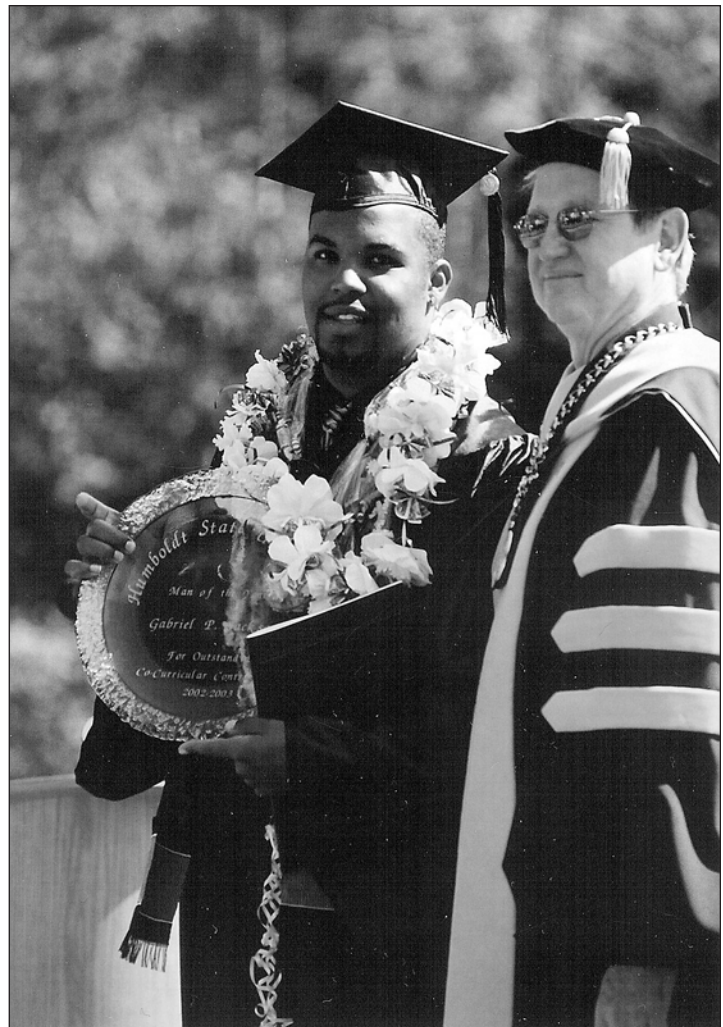
In 2001, Humboldt students claimed national championships in forestry and wildlife management by winning the national quiz bowls of the Society of American Foresters and the Wildlife Society. For the wildlife program, competing in its first national competition, the victory followed decades of dominance in regional competitions. In 2002 the wildlife team claimed the national crown again.

Building on Our Reputation

Humboldt State's sixth president, Dr. Rollin C. Richmond, is positioning the university to build on its high academic reputation and expand it even farther across the country. He notes that Humboldt's purpose is "to make a better world by helping people get the education they need to live fulfilling lives."

In meeting Humboldt's mission to provide quality education, generate new knowledge and help to use knowledge for individuals and our community, President Richmond has outlined a set of values for the university - excellence, fairness, diversity, honesty, trust, and openness. Those values are being applied to fulfilling the following Humboldt goals:

- be student-centered
- promote diversity of people and perspectives
- practice social and environmental responsibility
- be a role model for community involvement
- promote responsible economic development

JACKS' ACADEMICS

- Academics continue to be an emphasis of HSU's intercollegiate athletics programs. For the 2005-06 academic year, HSU student-athletes posted a 2.87 grade point average, increasing from the previous year's 2.86 average.
- During 2006-07, 37 student-athletes were recognized for their superior academic achievements by being named California Collegiate Athletic Association scholar athletes. In addition, seven women's rowing student-athletes earned national scholar-athlete honors, three softball student-athletes earned regional honors and one football player was named an ESPN The Magazine first team Academic All-American.
- 20 undergraduate students received hands-on experience as part of the athletic training program and eight graduate assistants were mentored through the training, coaching and strength programs.
- Over a five-year period, the graduation percentage (provided by HSU Office of Admissions and Records) for HSU student-athletes who begin as freshmen maintained a much higher rate (74%) compared to all students (46%). Transfer student-athletes have the same graduation rate after three years as other students.
- The CSU's voluntary gender equity in athletics annual report revealed that HSU was one of 14 among the 19 system campuses to meet all three Title IX criteria during the most recently studied academic year, 2005-06. HSU's participation numbers, expenditures and grants in-aid funding all were consistent with the directives of the 1993 Cal NOW consent decree.

Partly because of our unique atmosphere, the arts have flourished in Humboldt County. Statewide, Humboldt County is second only to Mendocino County in number of artists per capita, and is the home of many fine galleries and theatres.

As is typical in a university town, Humboldt is the area's focal point for music, theatre and art. More than 50 events are staged each year on campus, ranging from international celebrities to intimate performances by talented students.

Our CenterArts program, which has been cited as a "model in the west" by the National Endowment for the Arts, brings world-renowned and culturally diverse talent to the University. Guest artists include Los Lobos, Wynton and Branford Marsalis, Mary's Danish, Blues Traveler, Phish, Mark Russell, Manhattan Transfer and Alison Krauss. Check out the Center Arts web site to see what's coming up.

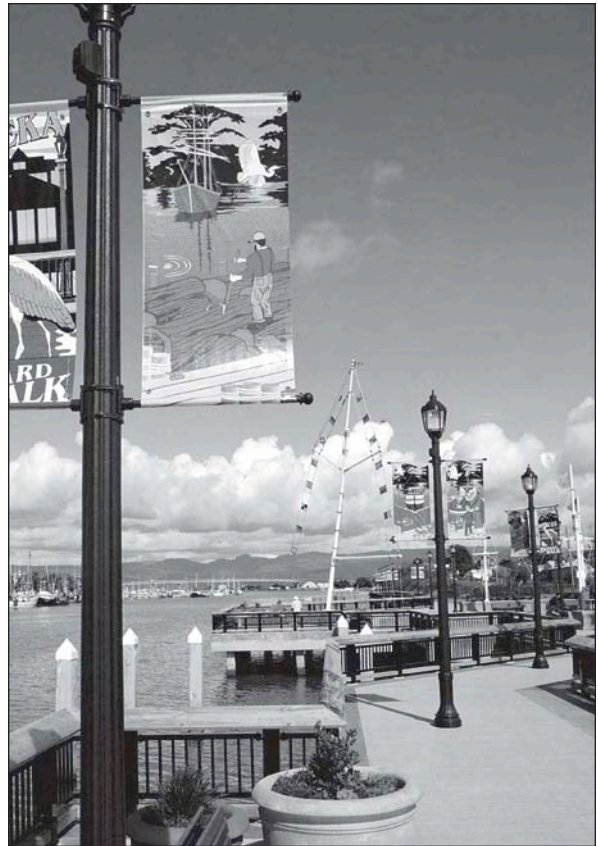
Dance, theatre, film and the visual arts are also important components of student sponsored cultural events, such as Black History Month, Native American Cultural Activity Day, and Cinco de Mayo. Humboldt State University also hosts the oldest student-run film and video festival in the country.

Off campus, you'll find additional innovative productions. Blue Lake, just a little more than five miles from Arcata, is home to the internationally known comedy and mime troupe, Dell'Arte. Ferndale, a tiny town famous for its Victorian architecture, lights up with the Ferndale Repertory Theatre. More drama can be found with Eureka's North Coast Repertory Theatre and the Humboldt Light Opera Company. The Humboldt Cultural Center hosts weekly Friday night concerts from October through June.

For sculpture, painting, photographs and other fine arts and crafts, you can visit one of the many galleries or restaurants which display works by local artists.

Other sources of entertainment are found within the local community as well. Music is very popular with our students and the city of Arcata's nightclub scene features modern rock-and-roll, R&B, funk, reggae, jazz and folk music for dancers and listeners over and under 21 years of age.

Downtown Arcata is also home to a movie theatre (4 screens), the newly refurbished Minor Theatre, the oldest operating movie theatre in the nation. This theatre feature first-run, foreign and artistic films. First-run movies are also presented at two theatres (15 screens) in Eureka.





The Environment

Founded in 1913, Humboldt is one of California's most beautiful university campuses. Located in Arcata, 275 miles north of San Francisco and 95 miles south of the Oregon border, on 145 acres of land, it is nestled in a spectacular setting of redwood forests, rushing rivers, solitary ocean beaches and mountain ranges.

A mild coastal climate similar to that of the San Francisco Bay area assures comfortable temperatures throughout the year. Temperatures average 63 degrees during the summer and 57 degrees year round.

Although rainfall is frequent, it is not oppressive. A typical pattern for fall and winter is three or four-day storms punctuated by brilliant sunny stretches that often last a week. Overall, Humboldt County receives an average of 37.5 inches of rain per year.

Nestled between the Pacific Ocean and low coastal mountains, Humboldt County's location contributes to a relaxed and casual lifestyle, free from the traffic, overcrowding, and pollution found elsewhere. There are more than 100 parks, 20 tennis courts and 16,000 acres of state parklands in the county.

When you need a break from books and classrooms, you'll have no trouble finding relief in Humboldt County. Whether you favor a bird watching expedition at dawn, a brisk jog during the afternoon or chamber music after twilight, you'll have numerous options.

Humboldt students spend much of their free time exploring nearby ocean beaches, bays, lagoons, marshes and forests.

You can go for a solitary walk or bicycle ride through the ten miles of trails in Redwood Park directly behind the campus. You can join a group of fellow students for an adventurous raft trip down the rapids of the Trinity River, or spend the day at the beach, surfing or clam digging.

As you hike, cycle or stroll through these uncrowded miles of unparalleled natural beauty, you'll discover, as thousands of Humboldt students have before you, the special inspiration of the North Coast.



Whether it's cheering the Lumberjacks in the East Gym or turning out for the annual Celebrity Dinner and Sports Auction, the community is supportive and generous to HSU athletics. That generosity has helped make athletic facilities at the university some of the best.



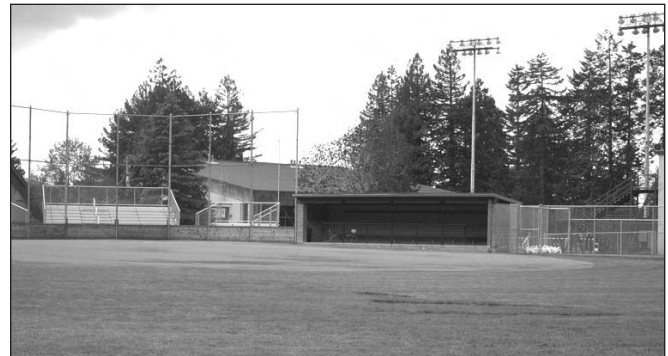
The brightly-decorated East Gym seats 1,400 fans and is a comfortable home for the HSU volleyball and basketball teams.



Surrounded by trees, Redwood Bowl is a beautiful setting for football and track and field events. In May of 2001, the natural grass in Redwood Bowl was replaced with a synthetic turf system. Under the carpet of nylon-based grass is an "E-layer" (for "elastic"), and among the blades is a fill of rubber granules - together representing more than 30,000 recycled tires. The all-weather track is considered one of the fastest anywhere.



The HSU Soccer Field has bleachers and additional seating on "the hill," a perfect setting to bring along a picnic lunch while enjoying all the action.



The HSU Softball field, located on the upper playing field adjacent to the field house, was ready for the 2003 home opener and dedicated on May 3, 2003.

Recent additions and renovations include a temporary 70-foot by 40-foot boat house completed in 2003 on the Eureka waterfront. This boat house will serve the Lumberjack crew team until the five million dollar aquatic center in partnership with the city of Eureka is completed.



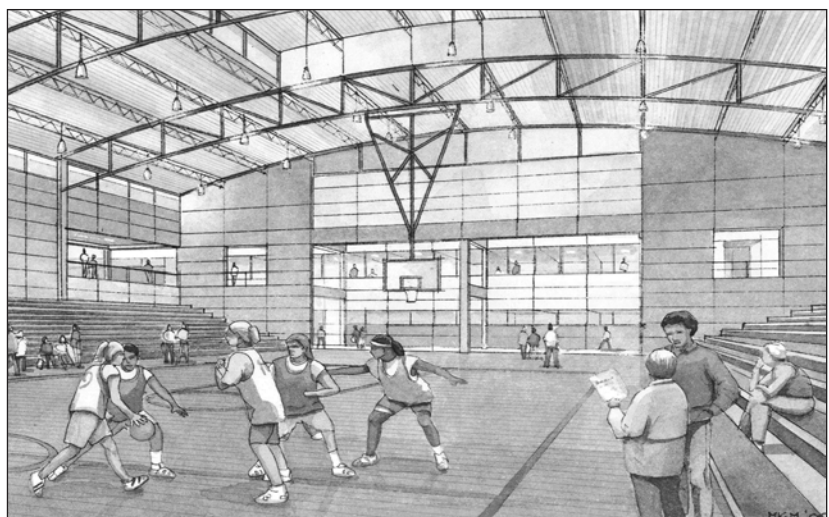
The aquatic center, currently in the developmental stages, will house a boat house for HSU crew. The women's locker room's were renovated in 2003 into a state-of-the-art facility providing separate team rooms for women's sports. Now open, as of July 2005, is the Student Recreation Center. The student body approved the construction of a 10,000 foot addition to the former "field house" for a fitness center. The facility has been renovated adding a three-lane jogging track, a synthetic surface, a five station climbing wall and a 3,000 seat concert and entertainment venue, providing students a broad spectrum of recreational and fitness activities.



In May of 2006, construction began on a new Health and Physical Education Complex, including a new gymnasium that will serve as home venue for Humboldt State's men's and women's basketball, and volleyball teams. At an approximate cost of \$48 million, the new facilities will also replace the natatorium, and related classroom, office, and support space in the current Forbes Complex.

The Lumberjacks' new home, with a targeted completion date of January 2008, will boast a 17,665 square-foot gym, with approximate seating for 2,000 fans. Occupancy of the building is slated for March of 2008.

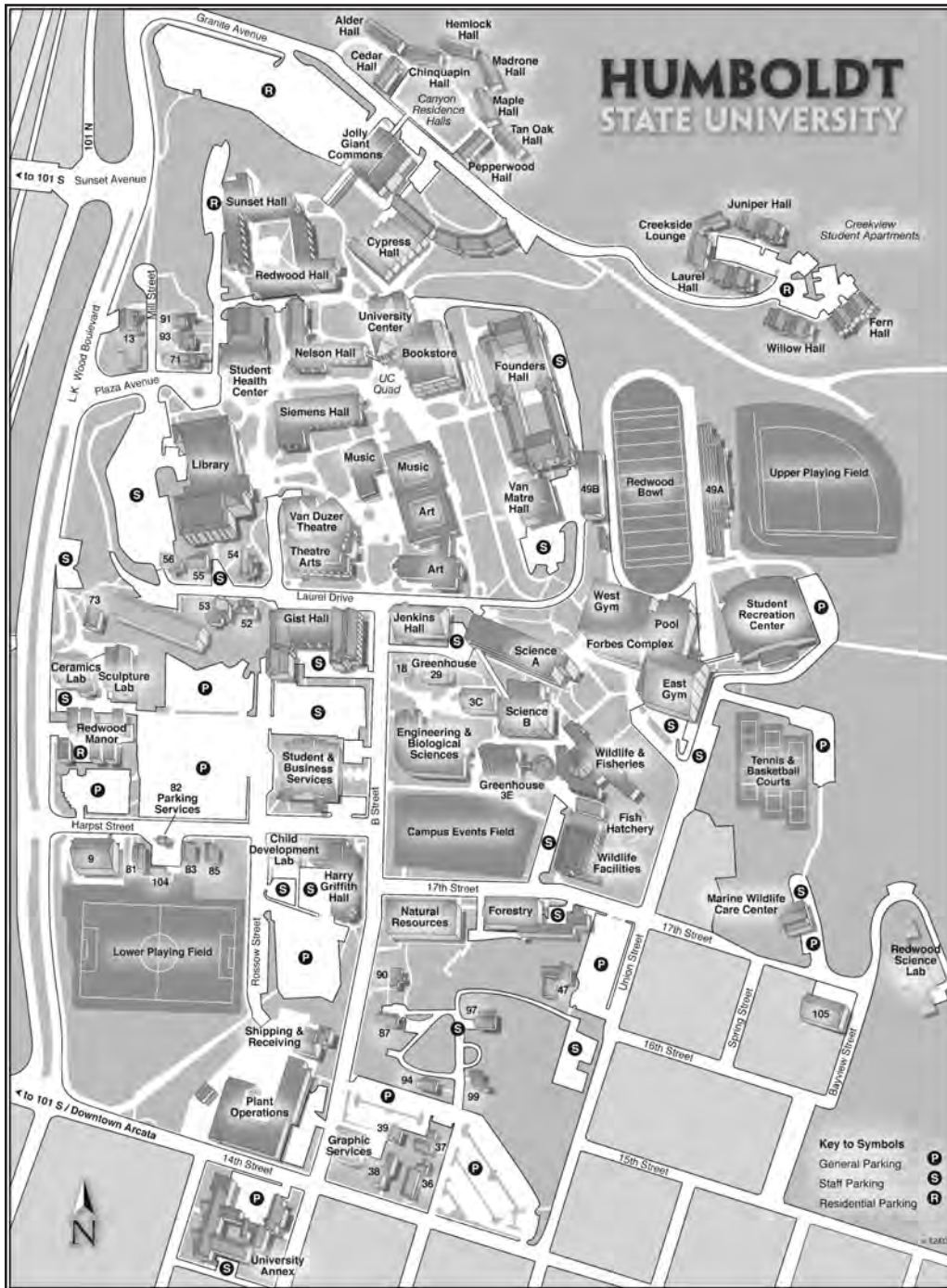
Phase II of the project will be the demolition of the old natatorium and installation of a plaza that will serve as a scenic entrance way to Redwood Bowl. All aspects of the project should be completed by early in 2009.



Directions to the Forbes Complex

From the north, heading down U.S. Hwy. 101, take the Sunset Ave. exit into Arcata. At the top of the ramp, proceed LEFT (east) on Sunset Ave. across the overpass to L.K. Wood Blvd. Proceed RIGHT (south) on L.K. Wood, which borders the Humboldt State campus to the west. Continue to 14th St. Make a LEFT (heading east) and go three blocks to Union St. Make a LEFT (north) onto Union, go up the hill and down again, continuing approximately four blocks. Union St. dead ends at the East Gym/Forbes Complex.

From the south, heading north on U.S. Hwy. 101, take the 14th St./Humboldt State University exit. At the top of the ramp make a RIGHT (east) on 14th St. Proceed to Union St. Make a LEFT (north) onto Union, go up the hill and down again, continuing approximately four blocks, Union St. dead ends at the East Gym/Forbes Complex.
